## **EROC Walkthrough**

<u>The Ethical Research Oversight Course or EROC</u> is an interactive online course UNC offers through <u>PRIM&R</u>. EROC explores the fundamental concepts, ethical principles, and federal regulations that IRB members need to protect human subjects. Each of the eight units contains a combination of text, audio narration, and interactive elements such as quizzes, case studies, and simulated IRB meetings.

The course is self-paced and takes about five and a half hours to complete in full.

You're not required to complete EROC to begin your work on the IRB. It's a great resource, though, if you're new or you need a refresher. Plus, you can earn up to 5 and half hours of continuing education credits, which count toward <u>CIP certification</u>.
